

Released Top Secret Ministry of Defence Records Reveal; UFO's Do Exist Or as the MOD put it; "That UFO's Exist Is Indisputable"

The documents in these secret files reveal that there were high level defence officials in the 1990's who believed UFOs were likely to be spacecraft piloted by extraterrestrials who could be visiting earth.

In 1993, an RAF Wing Commander, his name is blacked out in the documents, wrote to MoD officials about the need for a properly funded study.

In his report he says, "The national security implications of UFOs are considerable. We have many reports of strange objects in the skies and have never investigated them.

"If the sightings are of devices not of earth then their purpose needs to be established as a matter of priority.

There has been no apparently hostile intent and other possibilities are:

- (1) military reconnaissance,
- (2) scientific,
- (3) tourism."

The Wing Commander even goes as far as suggesting that we can learn from these craft.

"If the reports are taken at face value then devices exist that do not use conventional reaction propulsion systems, they have a very wide range of speeds and are stealthy. I suggest we could use the technology, if it exists."

These discussions within the MoD occurred in 1995, when documents were made public revealing that UFO reports were routinely copied to specialist "Defence Intelligence" branches.

An intelligence officer wrote to the UFO Desk: "I see no reason for continuing to deny that Defence Intelligence has an interest in UFOs.

"However, if the association is formally made public, then the MoD will no doubt be pressurised to state what the intelligence role/interest is.

"This could lead to disbelief and embarrassment since few people are likely to believe the truth that lack of funds and higher priorities have prevented any study of the thousands of reports received."

In 1996, an inquiry named Project Condign was finally launched without the knowledge of the then defence secretary Michael Portillo.

It was completed in 2000 under New Labour's Geoff Hoon.

The report concluded, "That (UFOs) exist is indisputable".

Credited with the ability to hover, land, take-off, accelerate to exceptional velocities and vanish, they can reportedly alter their direction of flight suddenly and clearly can exhibit aerodynamic characteristics well beyond those of any known aircraft or missile - either manned or unmanned."

It also said that, although UFO's existed, they did not pose any threat to defence.

The report did say that many sightings of UFOs were actually "plasmas of gas" caused by charges of electricity in the atmosphere.

The inquiry examined seven "near misses" involving RAF aircraft and "unexplained aerial phenomenon".

An unnamed author wrote that, "the possibility exists that a fatal accident might have occurred in the past as a result of aircrew avoiding a UFO".

The study recommended that pilots should make "no attempt, to out manoeuvre a UFO during interception".

The files also gave a behind the scenes picture on Britain's own 'Roswell', the Rendlesham Forest sightings of December 1980.

American air force soldiers and airmen saw a series of mysterious lights in the trees at the perimeter of an air base used by the U.S.

Air Force.

The file shows that Lord Hill-Norton, a former chief of the defence staff, told the then defence secretary, Michael Heseltine, that it was a "potential banana skin looming for the MoD".

He said if the account of the sighting by the US deputy base commander at USAF Woodbridge had to be dismissed then it was evidence that a sizeable number of American military personnel at important bases in British territory were capable of "serious misperception, the consequences of which might be grave in military terms".

In other words, either the UFO existed, or the Americans were stark raving bonkers!

The Rendlesham incident remains Britain's best-known UFO sighting and confirms the general MoD view that "it is clear from the reports that we receive that there are many strange things to be seen in the sky".

Many are seen by many people in different locations.

Bright lights seen across Devon and Cornwall, South Wales and Shropshire in the early hours of 31 March 1993 by seventy police and military witnesses were documented in more than thirty sightings reported to the MoD over a six-hour period.

The reports said it was very big, shaped like a catamaran and was completely silent.

The MoD's UFO desk, known as section (AS)2a, asked the RAF to replay its radar tapes but nothing unusual was detected.

The report generated by the UFO section to Sir Anthony Bagnall, the assistant chief of the air staff, that given the quality of the witnesses the sightings could not simply be written off.

"It seems that an unidentified object of unknown origin was operating in the UK air defence region without being detected on radar; this would appear to be of considerable defence significance."

There were detailed inquiries, particularly of the Americans, over whether they were testing any new "stealth" aircraft over Britain, but the MoD finally established what had been seen was a Russian rocket re-entering the earth's atmosphere after launching a Cosmos satellite.

The problem here is just like the little boy who often cried wolf to scare his village.

Every UFO sighting, Roswell, Rendlesham Forest and countless others, where there can be no doubt something has happened, are always denied by the establishment.

"We remain open-minded about these," is the official position.

As a CIA physiiist he attended a lecture many years ago given by the man behind the space race, and pioneer of US space travel, Wernher Von Braun.

Von Braun was born in Wirsitz, Germany, now Wyrzysk, Poland on 23 March 1912. earned his bachelor's degree at the age of 20 from the University of Berlin, where he also received his doctorate in physics in 1934.

U.S. Air Force Pilot Intercepted UFO Over Kent Recently Released By UK Ministry of Defence

Former U.S. Air Force pilot Lieutenant Milton Torres and a co-pilot had been ordered to scramble their F-86 D Sabre jet from a base in Kent to intercept what was thought to be an unknown aircraft spotted on radar.

It was during the Cold War and the Soviets were seen as a real threat and Torres said that the 'plane' he encountered read like what he called a "flying aircraft carrier" on his aircraft radar.

When it came into view he saw that it was a large craft that literally hung motionless in the sky and did not respond to hails for contact.

The order came to fire a salvo of rockets at the UFO. The authentication was valid and he selected 24 rockets.

"I had a lock-on that had the proportions of a flying aircraft carrier. The larger the airplane, the easier the lock-on. This blip almost locked itself," he recalls.

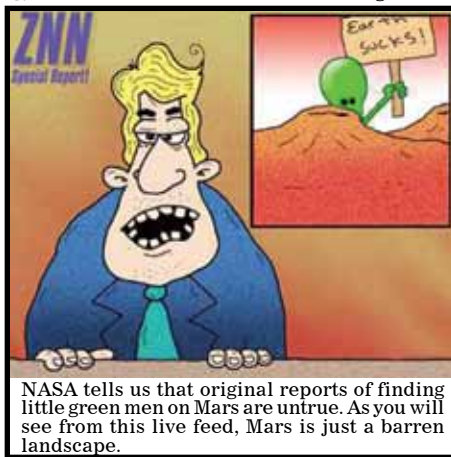
He was about to unload the twenty four missiles at the ship when it suddenly took off at what he reported at the time, were speeds he estimated at close to 12,000 kilometres per hour.

When the craft disappeared, the orders to fire were withdrawn and he was ordered back to base.

But it didn't end there, a "man in black" turned up the next day and he was debriefed by a non-descript man he remembers looking "like a well-dressed IBM salesman.

"He threatened me with a national security breach if I breathed a word about it to anyone," he claims.

Now, thirty years later, his story has finally surfaced after the files were released by the National Archives.
